Overview: Alternative Assessment research

This project will involve communicating with participants, creating research instruments and collecting and analyzing data.

Specific activities include, but are not limited to:

- literature review
- workshop design
- data collection instrument design
- project management (data collection, data analysis and interpretation, report writing and preparation of manuscripts for publication)
- assist with the development and organization of study documentation, forms, and resources
- regularly meet with the Principal Investigator and/or Research Team

The successful candidate will work with, and directly report to, Dr. Eliana Elkhoury at Athabasca University.

All meetings and individual and collaborative work will be conducted online.

Qualifications:

- Graduate student or graduate degree
- Experience with qualitative and quantitative research
- Preference will be given to applicants who have experience conducting interviews, teaching and using alternative assessments. Knowledge of assessment pedagogies is preferable.
- Good communication skills required
- Proficient writing skills
- Familiarity with qualitative/quantitative methods
