

# Research Assistant Opportunity Casual Position Co-creating Lasting Community Change through Co-design (CLC3)

### Position start date: April 2025

#### **Overview:**

We are looking for a graduate research assistant to join the Co-creating Lasting Community Change through Co-design (CLC3) project team to assist with a scoping review, individual interviews and community workshops held in-person and on-line. The successful candidate also will provide project management and communications support.

CLC3 is a partnership between The Social Impact Lab Alberta and Athabasca University. CLC3 is undertaking multi-sectoral research to advance knowledge and practice of co-design and codevelop an iterative, community-centred assessment tool to evaluate the results and contributions of community co-design to mutual-learning, citizen empowerment and enhanced community capacity.

#### Specific activities include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Provide communications and logistics support for research meetings and data organization collection across the CLC team
- 2. Contribute to the research ethics application
- 3. Undertake a scoping review of evaluative co-design tools/frameworks
- 4. Undertake individual interviews
- 5. Assist with design and delivery of in-person and on-line engagements
- 6. Contribute to academic knowledge and public information dissemination materials and activities
