## Overview


This course offers students an opportunity to pursue directed study in a topic of interest in women's and gender studies. No online study guide, required readings, or course materials are provided. This is a senior-level course and therefore students are expected to include and draw on a significant component of advanced, theoretical readings in feminism related to the area of study. Only students who have completed the **directed study approval form**  and have it approved by the Course Coordinator may register in the course.

## Evaluation


To **receive credit**  for this course, you must achieve a minimum grade of **D (50 percent)**  on all four assignments and an overall grade of D (50 percent) or better for the entire course. A failing grade of F will be assigned when the weighted composite score is 49% or lower or when any of the assignments does not receive a passing grade.
